ONE GREENVILLE. TWO REALITIES.

Greenville County continues to receive national attention as a popular destination for visitors and a magnet for new development. But despite this success, there's another side to Greenville that often goes unseen—one that creates a harsh reality for thousands of families who live it every day.



1,200 Greenville County residents are homeless.

70,000 people in Greenville County are living in poverty—that's roughly equivalent to the population of the city of Greenville.



52% of students (**38,000**) are on free/reduced lunch.



Only **50%** of 3rd-5th graders are meeting or exceeding expectations in English Language Arts and math, based on the results of state testing.



\$42,133 is the annual household income (\$19.94 hourly wage) needed for a family of three to meet basic financial needs.



\$15,080 is the average annual income of workers without a high school diploma.
