and treatment, as well as evidence-based treatment of adult anxiety,
depression, and substance use disorders in both individual and group
formats. She specialized in pediatric disorders comorbid with chronic
health conditions and has done inpatient treatment, as well as consult
and liaison services. After her internship, she completed a postdoctoral
fellowship at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine specializing in adherence.

Dr. Baker has extensive research experience in both pediatric and adult populations with a particular focus on behavioral medicine and health psychology. Her work focuses on the dissemination and implementation of evidence-based assessments and treatments in the community and in healthcare systems.

University Health Sciences Center and founder and Chief Scientific Officer of the Laura W. Bush Institute for Women's Health. By invitation of the U.S. FDA, she served from 2015 to 2019 as the director of medical and scientific initiatives for the Office of Women's Health.

Throughout her career, Dr. Jenkins has developed a sex and gender women's health fellowship program, launched the inaugural US Sex and Gender Education Summit in 2018, served as a consultant for the NASA sex and gender decadal review, helped found the Sex and Gender Women's Health Collaborative, and performed expert advisory roles within NIH and HRSA.

In addition to her many journal publications, she led the development of the signature textbook in this space, How Sex and Gender Impact Clinical Practice: An Evidence-Based Guide to Patient Care, published by Elsevier (2020), and has co-authored two consumer books.

Dr. Jenkins has presented world-wide on the topic of sex and gender research and clinical care and has been recognized with numerous

awards for her work in sex and gender education, research, clinical care, and health policy.
