TELL STORIES THAT CHANGE NARRATIVES AND INSPIRE

Knowing is only half the battle. To unite the community behind real solutions, we tell stories that reframe common narratives about the causes of poverty and how to solve it.

FIGHT FOR POLICIES THAT HELP, NOT HURT

It takes more than money to win for our community. We advocate at all levels of government for policies that help us beat back poverty.



Our Policy & Advocacy Framework defines criteria for issue selection and prioritization, as well as guidance for evaluating the level of engagement and risk for each issue. We have three tiers of involvement in public policy:

TIER 1 – LEAD

- Provide or prepare data-informed testimony
- Convene partners and stakeholders
- Direct engagement with policy makers

TIER 2 – ENGAGE

- Advocate when directed by leading organization
- · Participate in hearings or meetings
- · Share data and stories to shift mental models
- Lend capacity building support to leading organization

TIER 3 – SUPPORT

- Sign on letters
- Status updates
- · Share media messaging
